

Conditions of Entry

By entering this facility, all persons agree:

- To conduct themselves in a proper and reasonable manner and in accordance with Basketball SA's Codes of Behaviour.
- To comply with any regulations or directions implemented by Basketball SA or any relevant authority to manage infectious diseases or other health and safety risks.
- To be bound by Basketball SA rules and by-laws, including the Competition Rules of Operation, Member Protection Policy, and Video and Photography Policy. A breach of these rules and by-laws may result in disciplinary action.
- To uphold a child-safe environment that is free from harm, and where children feel respected, valued, and encouraged to reach their full potential.
- To follow the Behaviour Management Framework and comply with any reasonable direction from basketball staff or officials.

By entering this facility, all persons accept:

- Mobile phones and cameras must not be used in any change room.
- The act of "courtsiding" or the unauthorised transmission of match data in any format (including by data scouts, journalists, commentators, etc.) without the express written consent of Basketball Australia is strictly prohibited.
